Museum strives for €100,000 in BankGiro Loterij Museumprijs 2017

Amsterdam, March, 27 2017 – Exciting times for the TextielMuseum in Tilburg. The museum is nominated for the BankGiro Loterij Museumprijs 2017 (Museum Prize). Winning this prestigious prize with an amount of € 100,000 is for the museum an enormous recognition and will contribute to the realisation of its dream. Museum Boijmans van Beuningen in Rotterdam and the Stedelijk Museum 's-Hertogenbosch are the other competitors. It is the tenth public prize that will be awarded, this time with a focus on Design & Fashion. Public voting starts today via www.museumprijs.nl and ends on April, 30th.

This year's BankGiro Loterij Museumprijs is intended for the museum that presents its design and/or fashion collection the best to a broad audience. The 3 nominees are selected by an [expert jury](#). Now it is up to the audience to decide which museum may call itself 'Museum of the Year' and will be able to fulfil its dream.

TextielMuseum Tilburg's dream: TextielLab innovation

Errol van de Werdt, director TextielMuseum Tilburg: "Winning this prize would mean a huge investment in our future plans and vision. We want people to enter as a visitor and leave as a creator. We therefore desire to buy a loom with which the visitor can create its own tea towel: 'personal fabrication'."

Opinion of the jury

According to the jury, the TextielMuseum offers a unique combination of history and contemporary design. It has high quality permanent exhibitions as well as interesting temporary ones. Furthermore, there is a studio/lab where artists and designers are at work. The museum is appealing to a broad audience as well as to high end users and its quality level is extraordinary in all its facets. On Thursday, May 11 the winner of the BankGiro Loterij Museumprijs 2017 will be announced.
